The power of local government is controlled by Acts of State Parliament such as the Local Government Acts.

Local councils are concerned with matters close to our homes, such as building regulations and development, public health, local roads and footpaths, parks and playing fields, libraries, local environmental issues, waste disposal, and many community services.

These tasks would be difficult for a state government to manage because they are local issues. Councils can deliver services adapted to the needs of the community they serve.

Local government areas vary greatly in size and character.

There are 128 Local Government Areas in NSW. A local council area may be called a City, Municipality or Shire Council.





Council Meetings

Council Meetings are held every month and are open to the public to attend. It is a good way for the community to see how local decision-making takes place.

You can attend the Meeting as an observer, or you can request to speak at these Meetings. To speak at a Council Meeting you must complete a 'Request to Speak' form by 5pm on the day before the Meeting. You can find the form on Council's website.

About Bayside Council

Located in the heart of Sydney, the Bayside Local Government Area stretches over 29 suburbs from Bexley and Kingsgrove in the west to Pagewood and Daceyville in the east, Arncliffe in the north through to Mascot and down to the coastal communities of Brighton Le Sands and Sandringham.

Bayside Council has two major transport hubs, the Sydney Kingsford Smith Airport in Mascot and Port Botany, the largest container port in NSW.

There are five Wards and fifteen elected Councillors, the elected leader of Bayside Council is called the Mayor. The role of the Mayor and Councillors is to represent the views and interests of their community to Council.


Council Newsletter



Parking Permits



Council offers Resident Parking Permits to eligible residents that live within a property located in a designated resident parking scheme. The application form needs to be completed and payment can be made at our Customer Service Centre in Eastgardens or Rockdale.

Resident Parking Permits are issued annually and expire each year on 30 September.
